**Notice of firearms training in our Parish:** Thames Valley Police will be training at the Chinnor and Princes Risborough Railway station again on Monday the 26th of November between 0900-1600hrs.

Message from TVP - we do not use loud blank ammunition so as not to disturb the residents. The ammunition that we use is called Simunition blank ammunition and is a lot quieter than blank ammo. We do not use any sort of pyrotechnic so there are no loud bangs either. The only real noise comes when we are conducting the scenarios in the afternoon when roles actors and officers may shout.

## CHINNOR EMERGENCY PLAN - 2018 UPDATE

The success of the Chinnor Emergency Plan is dependent on volunteers known as street friends who, in the event of an emergency and most specifically a flu epidemic, would be willing to and available to look out for their neighbours who may need help.

This may include:

- Shopping
- Getting medication from pharmacy (people with multiple prescriptions who use a dossette box will have this filled by the pharmacy and will not be the responsibility of the SF).
- Co ordinate and, where necessary, cover for other SF in the vicinity to conserve fuel/time.

It is envisaged that the role may develop and change over time. Ideally it would be best to have one or more volunteers if roads are long.

Most of Chinnor is covered but we do need volunteers from the new developments in Mill Lane, Thame Road and the Crowell Road development and Old Kiln Lakes.

Other roads we need volunteers for are:

Benwells, Cherry Tree Road, Church Road, Cromwell Court, Duck Square, Elm Drive, Emmington, Fox Cover, Grafton Orchard, Glimbers Grove, Glynswood, Greenwood Meadow, Hernes Oak, Holland Close, Hunter's Point, Keens Lane, Leybourne Gardens, Lime Grove, Malyn's Close, Meadow Road, Musgrave Road, Oak End Road, Old Sawmill Place, Riders Way, Robins Platt, St. Andrew's Road, Seymour Park Road, Timber Way, Wainhill, Walnut Tree Close, Wheelers End, Wykham Rise.

All minutes from committee meetings are posted on the website following ratification at the following monthly Full Council meeting.

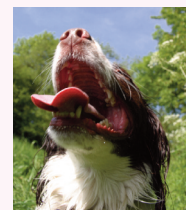
## CHINNOR PLAY AREAS
