CHINNOR DEFIBRILLATORS

If a defib unit is required you do not need to know the exact locations.



Call **999** and the emergency services will direct you to the closest unit.

Chinnor Community First Responders run regular training sessions as required, but the emergency services talk you through the entire process so don't worry.

For information please find below the location of the public accessible 24 hours a day defib units. (other units are in the village but not 24 hr accessible / not managed by CPC)

Wheatsheaf public house, Oakley Road

Whites Field Community Hall, Mill Lane

Chinnor Community Pavilion, Station Road

Chinnor Village Centre, High Street

If you need to use the unit you must ring 999.

The ambulance service will direct you to the nearest unit, give you the access code to open the cupboard and then instruct you fully on usage instructions.

DEFIBRILLATORS FAQs

1) Has one of the units be used yet?

Yes, the Whites Field defib unit was recently deployed and thank fully saved a life.

2) How do I know where the defibrillators are?

Don't worry, the ambulance service control room knows where they are so you don't need to memorise their locations. Ambulance control will ask you if you are on your own or if there are other people present. Follow their instructions.

3) How do I know how to work the defibrillator?

You don't need to. Once you have open the defibrillator it will tell you exactly what to do (in a very loud voice which can be quite alarming) Just follow its instructions.

4) If the patient comes round do we still need the ambulance?

Yes the person will still need to go to hospital so keep on the phone to the ambulance service.

5) Suppose I make a mistake and hurt the patient?

You will not do any harm to the patient. If their heart has stopped and they are not breathing, it can only get better. It is totally the responsibility of the defibrillator to assess for, and deliver the shock to the patient.

REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY

Remembrance Day is on **Sunday 11th November** with a ceremony being conducted at the War Memorial at 10:50 am prior to an Interdenominational Service at St Andrews Church. Limited road closures will be in place.

EXTRA GARDEN WASTE COLLECTIONS

Residents across southern Oxfordshire who are signed up for brown bin collections can put out twice as much garden waste during the extra garden waste weeks this month.

South Oxfordshire and Vale of White Horse district councils are giving those who are part of the paid-for service the opportunity to put out the equivalent of one extra bin's worth of garden waste (around three large 80 litre bin bags) in the week commencing 22 October.

Residents should leave their extra garden waste out in bin liners or sacks beside their brown bins on their usual collection day during these weeks. Trade waste bags will not be accepted, however you can re-use old compost bags.

The garden waste is taken to a recycling plant in Oxfordshire where it is used to make compost, which goes to local farmers, allotment holders and an annual compost giveaway. However, there are increasing reports that the waste is being contaminated with non-compostable items such as plant pots, plastic bags and bottles.

What CAN be put into the brown bin: Leaves, Grass, Weeds
Flowers and plants, Hedge clippings, Branches (not more than 10cm thick), Prunings and twigs, Windfall fruit
Hay / Straw / Sawdust (soiled animal bedding from non-meat eating animals only eg rabbits), Vegetable waste from the garden only eg potato tops (not kitchen waste)
